1 Overview

The Edge AI Box is a device intended for high-speed AI processing for large amounts of data on-site. The Edge AI Box Advance MKII 5G contains a 5G module that provides support for Sub-6 communication. Moreover, high-speed LTE transmission is available in regions that do not support 5G. A 256 GB NVMe drive and two of 7/24 2TB HDD come standard for maximum performance. The NVIDIA T4 server GPU contains 320 Turing Tensor Cores, allowing for high-speed Deep Learning inference. Besides 5G model, LTE model and Wi-Fi model are also available for customer choices.

1.1 Key Features of the Edge AI Box Advance MKII

■ NVIDIA T4 (server machine learning GPU) included

The NVIDIA T4 was included for increased performance, and the Turing architecture allows for high-speed inference processing. The camera stream supports simultaneous processing from over 20 devices.

■ Deep Learning

The Edge AI Box Advance MKII is a miniature computer capable of environmental deep learning inference.

■ Edge Computing

Cameras and sensors are located nearby, allowing for real-time data processing. This reduces transmission latency, loss due to data compression, as well as data transmission costs. Moreover, analysis of uncompressed images provides superior precision. Discover hazards in real time and alert alarm systems for immediate risk avoidance.

■ Process data from ubiquitous IoT devices.

This small product can be installed near IoT devices, allowing for ethernet, USB, HDMI, and 5G/LTE/Wi-Fi compatibility.

■ Standard 256 GB NVMe and two 7/24 2.5" 2 TB HDD

The NVMe drive is used for the OS and high-speed inference processing, while two 2.5" 7/24 2 TB HDD are used to store data. Users also have the option of switching to SATA SSDs.

■ Includes a 5G communication module

The Advance MKII is compatible with 5G (Sub-6) communication. Moreover, high-speed LTE is available automatically in regions that do not support 5G. The Edge AI Box Advance MKII uses communication to send analysis result logs, samples, metadata, and other information at high speeds to the cloud.

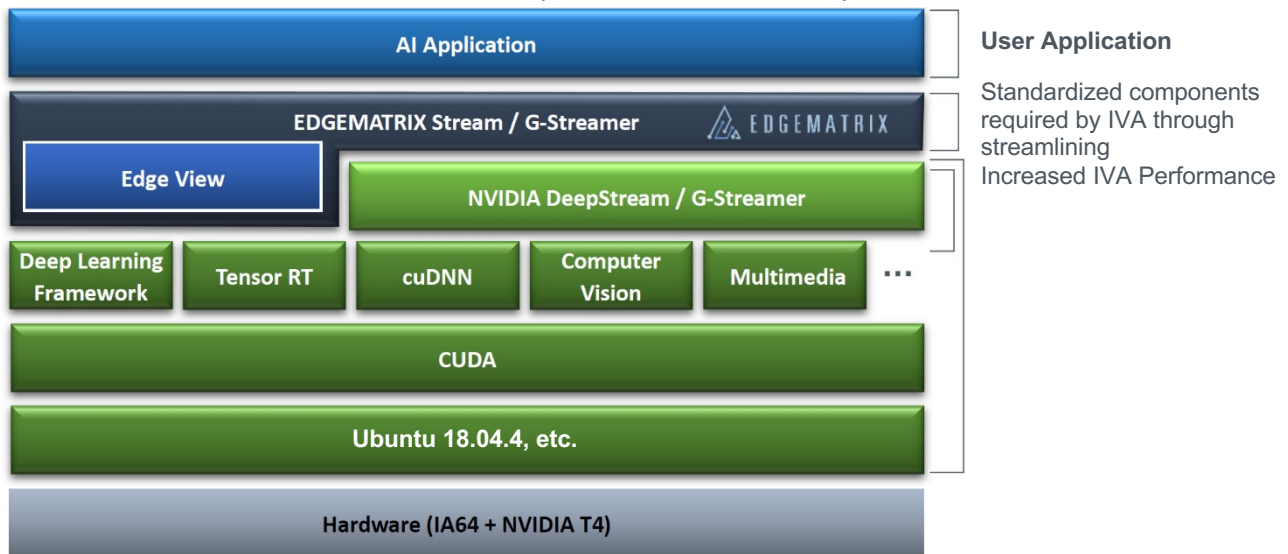

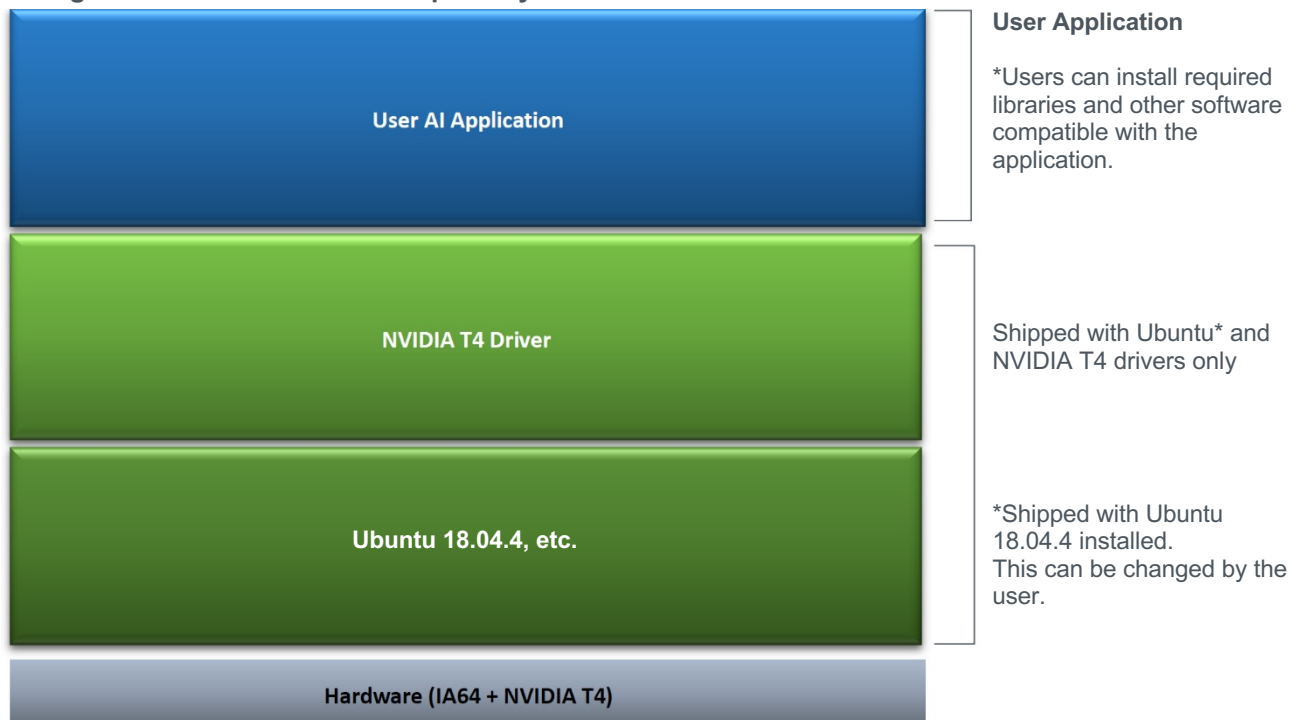
The Edge AI Box Advance MKII uses a smart fan that changes speed depending on the temperature of the NVIDIA T4 GPU.

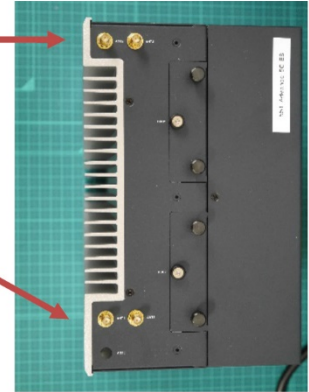

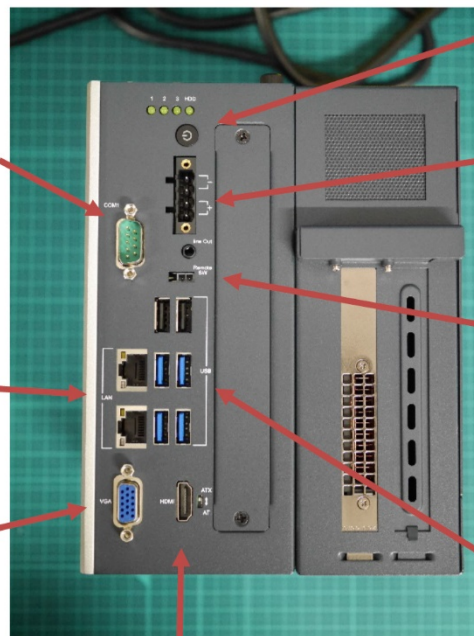
Serial port (RS232)

Ethernet connector x 2

Connects with LAN cable.

VGA Connector

Connects with VGA-compatible monitor.



HDMI Connector

Connects with HDMI-compatible monitor.

Power button

Turns on power to the Edge AI Box Advance MKII.

Power connector

Connects with the included AC adapter.

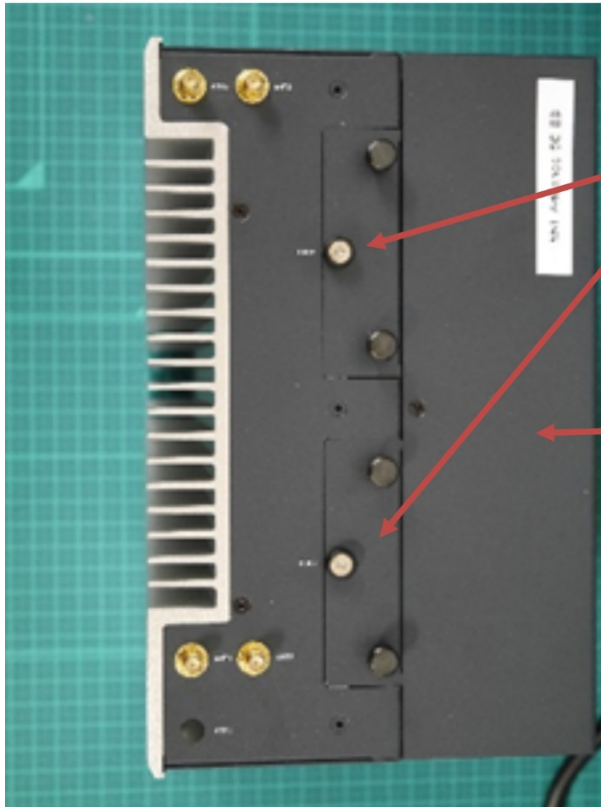
AT-ATX switch

Switch to AT side when power is on for automatic startup.

USB 2.0 connector x 2

USB 3.0 connector x 4

Used for connecting external devices such as keyboards, mice, sensors, FA machine vision cameras, and others.

**HDD port x 2**

Houses 2.5" HDD.

Secure with center screw.

Grasp the two knobs. Pull upwards to remove, and push downwards to load.

Each 7/24 2 TB HDD can be loaded separately.

NVIDIA T4 housing unit

The NVIDIA T4 is housed here.

This device depends on air cooling, so please keep this housing covered when in use.

4 Peripheral Device Connectivity

About LAN cables

Please use category 5 or higher LAN cable compatible with gigabit ethernet.

4.2 Connection

- 1 A keyboard and mouse can be connected to the Edge AI Box Advance MKII via the USB connector.**
- 2 A monitor can be connected to the Edge AI Box Advance MKII via the HDMI connector.**
- 3 The AC adapter plugs into a wall outlet.**



- 4 Press the power button.**

When the Edge AI Box Advance MKII is turned on, the power button will change from orange to green and Ubuntu will boot up. Shortly afterwards, the Ubuntu login screen will appear.

- * It may take several seconds for the Ubuntu login screen to appear. Please be patient, and do not turn off the power.

5 BIOS Settings

Hold the DEL or ESC key when powering on to enter the BIOS settings.

In the BIOS settings, you can determine settings for each device, as well as chipset, security, boot, and other settings.

This is similar to the BIOS of a PC. A detailed explanation is not provided in this document.

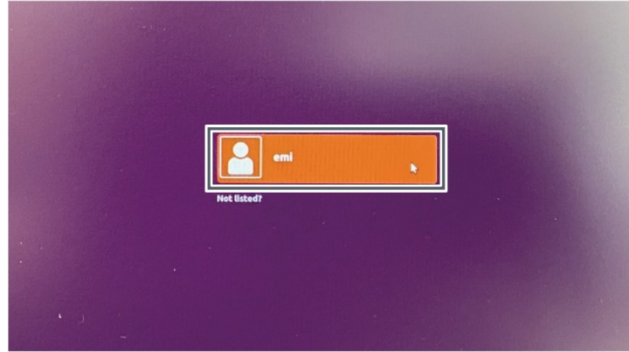
If using the EDGEMATRIX service, please do not change the TPM settings. If changed, service may be suspended.

6 Login and Initialization Screen

When connecting peripheral devices to the Edge AI Box Advance, the monitor, mouse, keyboard, or other device will become enabled. After starting up the Edge AI Box Advance, the Ubuntu login screen will appear. Login to Ubuntu to use Edge AI Box Advance. The Ubuntu version is 18.04.4.

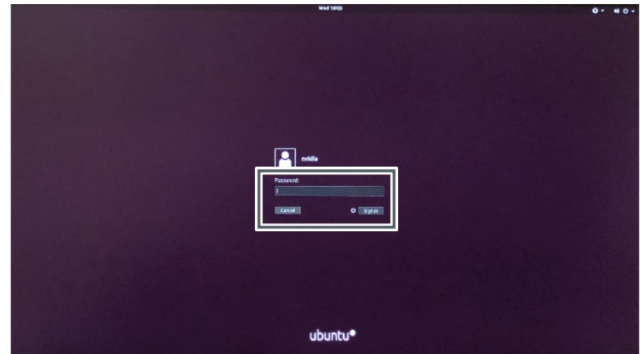
1 Click “emi”.

The password entry screen will appear.



2 Enter “emi” in the password field, then click “Sign in” or press the ENTER key.

Ubuntu will then login and the desktop will appear.

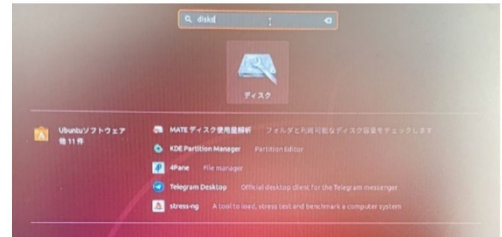
For security, please change your Ubuntu password after logging in.

7 Initializing and Swapping the HDD

7.1 Initializing the HDD

The Ubuntu disks application is used to initialize the HDD.

After logging in, click “show applications” below and type “disks” in the search field. Then, select the application shown in the image to the right. The image to the right will show when Japanese is the selected language.



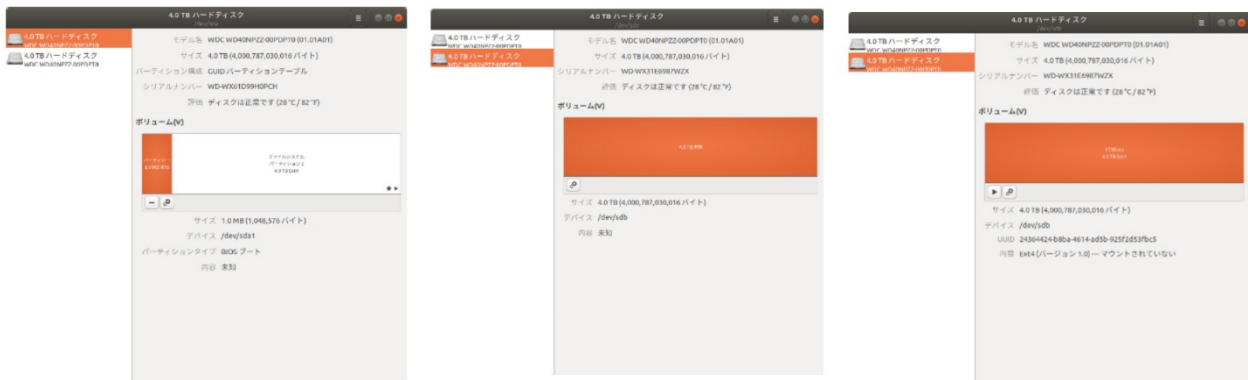
Open the Disks application to see a display as shown in the bottom left image. 256GB NVMe and two 7/24 2 TB HDD drives will be shown on the left, and the selected disk contents will be shown on the right. Ubuntu will then install the NVMe.

Some HDDs are not initialized when shipped. In this is the case, “unknown” will be displayed upon selection as shown in the lower middle image.

Click the gear button on the lower left side of the “unknown” message to initialize the disk.

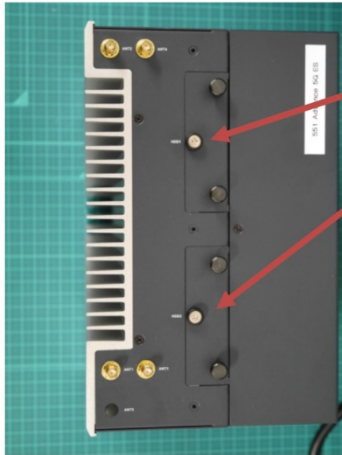
Once the disk is initialized, the bottom right image will appear.

Next, click the PLAY button that newly appears to the left of the gear button to mount the disk.



7.2 Swapping the HDD

Turn off the power when swapping disks.



HDD port x 2

Loosen the screw at the center of the swap port, then grasp the two knobs and pull upwards to remove. Likewise, push downwards to load a disk.



HDD holder

Pull out the HDD holder in the manner shown in the image to the left.



Flip over the HDD holder

Flip over the HDD holder to reveal 4 countersunk screws securing the disk in place.

Remove these screws, exchange the disk, then tighten the screws. Afterwards, return the holder to the main unit.

8 Network Settings

8.1 Preparing the connectivity environment

This is an explanation of the connectivity environments for this product. The user must set up each connectivity environment.



The Edge AI BOX Advance MKII can simultaneously connect to 2 or more ethernet, WiFi, 5G, or LTE networks. When using 2 or more networks simultaneously, we recommend using static routing. Routing can prevent IP packets from degrading.

8.1.1 Ethernet

A monitor can be connected to the Edge AI Box Advance MKII via the HDMI connector.

There are two connectors.

*The LAN is 1000BASE-T.



Ethernet does not support PoE.
If using an IP camera, please use a PoE hub.

8.1.2 5G Module

In addition to the EDGEMATRIX SIM (MVNO using the NTT Docomo network), the following SIM providers may be used.

- SoftBank (coming soon)



Notice

SIM card

- The Edge AI Box Light uses a standard SIM card. A converter card may be required if you use a microSIM or nanoSIM card.
- Please refer to the instruction manual that came with your SIM card for a detailed explanation of SIM card settings.

SIM card insertion

- Be sure to turn off the Edge AI Box Light and ensure that it is placed on a stable surface prior to inserting a SIM card.
- Do not touch the IC portion of the SIM card.
- Be careful not to bend, crush, or otherwise damage the SIM card.
- LTE cannot be used unless the SIM card is securely inserted into the LTE module.

Body SAR

The Edge AI Box Light does not comply with Body SAR specifications. Please use with the antenna placed at least 20cm from human bodies.

Body SAR

Body SAR regulations apply to devices with antennas placed within 20cm of human bodies.

National guidelines on technical standards for electromagnetic radiation absorbed by the human body, as well as international guidelines on electromagnetic radiation exposure prevention, must be followed. Such international guidelines include those held by the World Health Organization (WHO), of which permitted values have been determined to be sufficiently safe regardless of the age or health status of the user.

Permitted electromagnetic radiation exposure prevention values proposed by national law and international guidelines express the average electromagnetic energy absorbed by the human body.

SAR (Specific Absorption Rate) defines a tolerable local value of 2.0W/kg (not including from the wrists down, which possess a value of 4.0W/kg).

SIM card insertion

SIM cards are inserted into the Edge AI Box Advance MKII. This example uses 5G model.

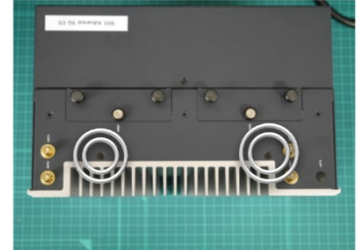


Notice

You may insert a SIM card with referring the following procedure by yourself. Please notify that failures and issues caused by your errors may be out of warranty. EDGEMATRIX Toolkit Box and EDGEMATRIX Service Box covers may not be opened. If you need to open, please contact EDGEMATRIX before opening. If you open without any notice to EDGEMATRIX, the warranty may end.

1 When inserting a SIM card, open from the heat sink side of the housing.

Remove the two screws at the top and bottom positions as shown in the image to the right. Then, remove the heat sink (green portion) from the housing. Next, you will find that heat has caused strong adhesion that requires force to remove. However, be sure not to bend the housing or the heat sink.



2 Once the heat sink is removed, the device should resemble the image to the right.

The image to the right shows the housing with the heat sink removed. The 5G module is located to the upper right. The SIM socket is to the left. The image shows a SIM already inserted. However, no SIM card is included initially.



Be sure not to remove the yellow object attached to the site where the heat sink was removed. This is the heat sink pad, which allows heat to escape from the device via the heat sink. Moreover, heat sink thermal paste is applied to the CPU portion. Please do not remove this paste. If there is insufficient thermal paste, additional store-bought thermal paste may be added.

3 After inserting the SIM as in the image to the right, return the heat sink to complete the process.



Notice

5G/LTE firmware may differ depending on the type of SIM card used.

Upon powering on the Edge AI Box following SIM card insertion, a firmware update screen may appear. In this event, do not activate the Edge AI Box's sleep mode and do not turn off the power.

Moreover, do not disconnect the network while the firmware is updating.

■ Attaching the 5G antenna

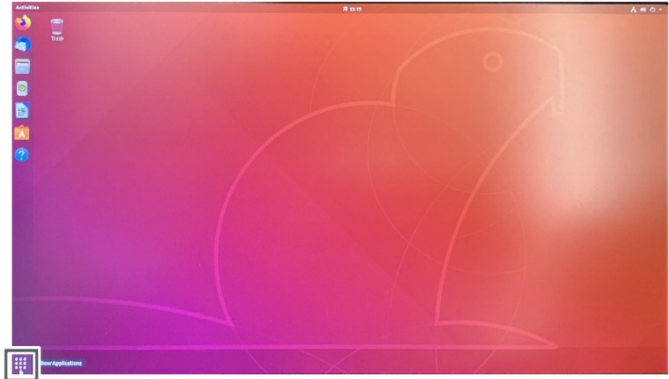
Connect the included 5G antenna to the 5G antenna connector (4 connects located on the top of the device).
LTE model and Wi-Fi model has only two antenna connectors.



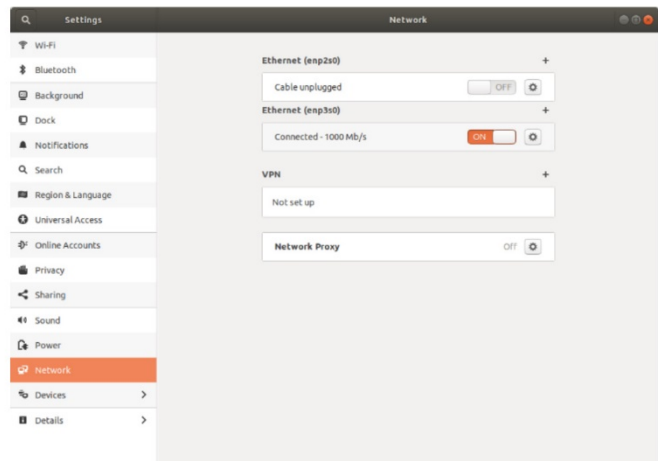
8.2 Network Settings

Use the System Settings function to set up the network.

- 1** Click “show applications” on the lower left of the screen, then click the **System Settings** icon.
The System Settings screen will appear.



- 2** If using **ethernet**, select **Network**.
The Network settings screen will appear.
 - If working in a DHCP environment, you can usually connect automatically using a LAN cable connection.
 - Clicking on Option will also allow you to set a fixed address.

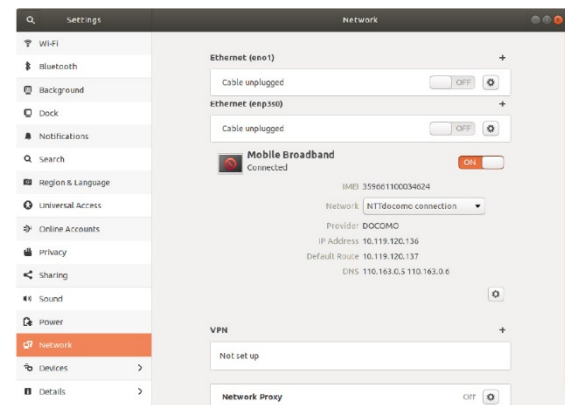
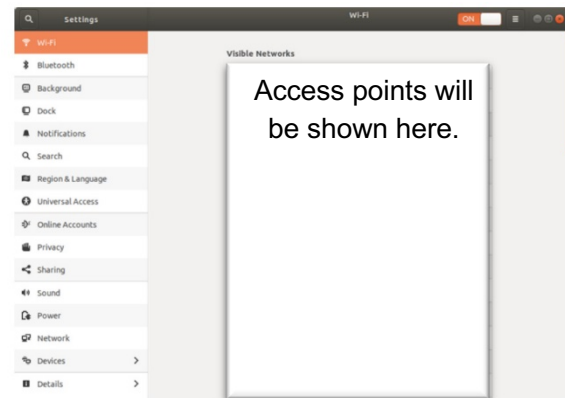


3 If using 5G, select Mobile Broadband.

The network settings screen will appear.
Ubuntu does not yet support 5G display, but the settings are the same as for LTE.

Set your country/region, provider, billing plan, APN, and other details in order.

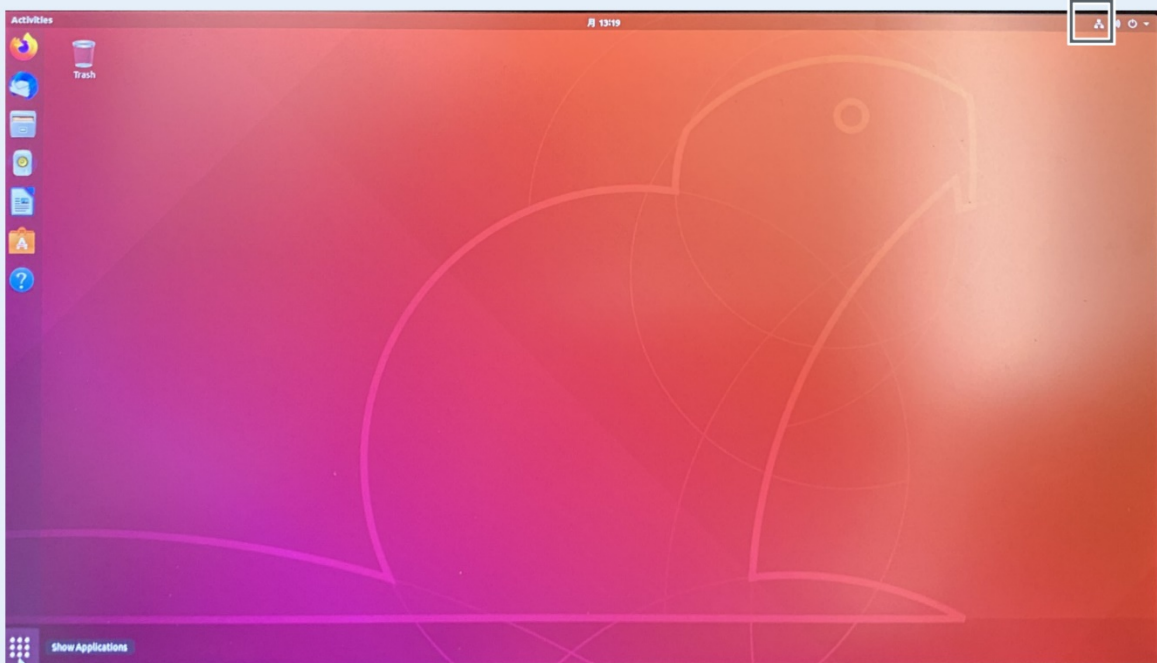
- Clicking on Option will also allow you to set an IP address.



Hint

Network settings from the network status icon

Click the network status icon on the upper right of the desktop to display network status. You can also set network elements here by clicking the different settings.



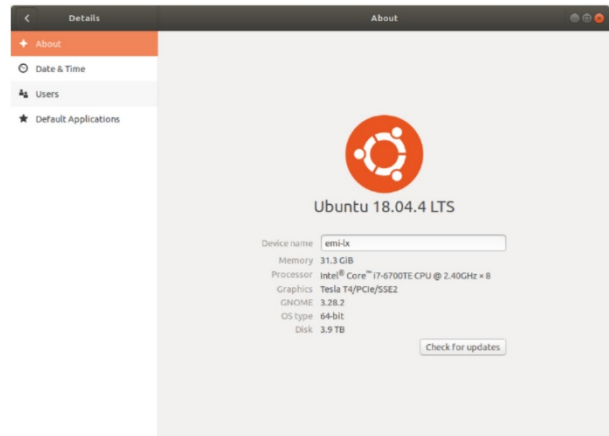
9 NVIDIA T4 Driver Updates and Commands

9.1 Check your NVIDIA T4 Driver

You can check your driver version from System Settings or using the terminal command prompt.

Selecting Details from the System Settings will show the screen in the image to the right. If you see your GPU's name from the Graphics menu on the screen, the appropriate driver is installed and in operation.

*The Tesla T4 is currently called NVIDIA T4.



Alternatively, open the terminal and use the `nvidia-smi` command to check your driver version and GPU name.

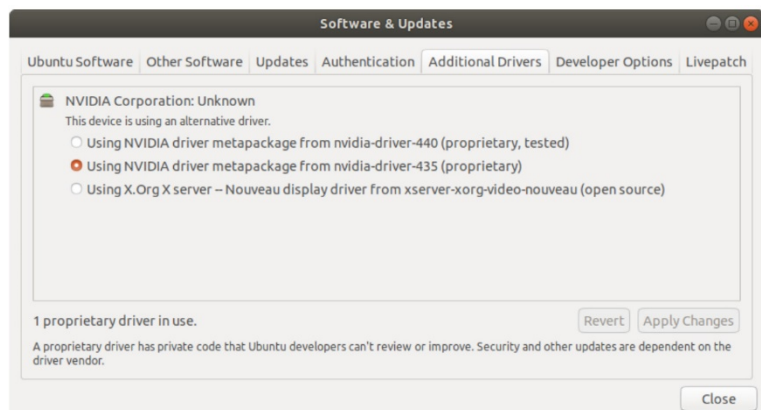
9.2 Update your NVIDIA T4 Driver

You can update your driver by making changes under Software & Updates.

Implement Software & Updates from the Applications menu.

Select the Additional Drivers tab to navigate to the Driver selection screen. Then, select the updated driver and click Apply Changes.

As of March 2021, this method does not install the correct Driver. The following outlines our company's installation method.



Driver installation at EDGEMATRIX, Inc.:

- 1) DATACENTER DOCUMENTATION follows the NVIDIA Driver Installation Quick Start Guide.

- 2) Install and set CUDA.

CUDA 10.2

Run the following command to install CUDA 10.2:

```
sudo apt-get -y install cuda-10-2
```

Export the paths for CUDA 10.2 by adding the following lines to your ~/.bashrc file:

```
export PATH=/usr/local/cuda-10.2/bin${PATH:+:${PATH}}
export LD_LIBRARY_PATH=/usr/local/cuda-10.2/lib64*${LD_LIBRARY_PATH:+:${LD_LIBRARY_PATH}}
```

Apply the changes:

```
source ~/.bashrc
```

- 3) If you reboot at this point, the UI will not be shown. The following solves the issue of X11 (used by Option B platform).

Fix X11 Incompatibility:

Option A. Wayland

When starting session click on your user, click on settings icon and select Ubuntu on Wayland before enter your password.

Option B. Setting up the xorg.conf file

If Option A didn't work, edit or create the `/etc/X11/xorg.conf` file with the following content before reboot:

```
Section "Device"
    Identifier   "Intel"
    Driver      "Intel"
    BusId       "PCI:0:2:0"
EndSection
```

```
Section "Screen"
    Identifier   "Intel"
    Driver      "Intel"
EndSection
```

Option C. Installing lightdm

The main issue could be given by the incompatibility between some Gnome versions and NVIDIA drivers. You can check your current display manager name with:

```
cat /etc/X11/default-display-manager
```

A possible output is `/usr/sbin/gdm3`, which is a problematic version. One solution is to install lightdm:

```
sudo apt-get install lightdm
sudo dpkg-reconfigure lightdm
```

Select lightdm instead gdm3 during the installation and you will get X11 working fine.

4) Finally, reboot and check.

Reboot and check the NVIDIA Driver and CUDA installations:

```
nvcc --version
nvidia-smi
```

This process should allow you to use T4 as well as enable X and GNOME onboard graphics settings.

10.1 Japanese support using fcitx

Japanese language is supported by fcitx-mozc.

fcitx-mozc can be installed using the method shown in the figure below (sudo apt install fcitx-mozc) and then rebooting.

Afterwards, users can switch between Japanese and half-width characters using the kanji switch key on the Japanese keyboard.

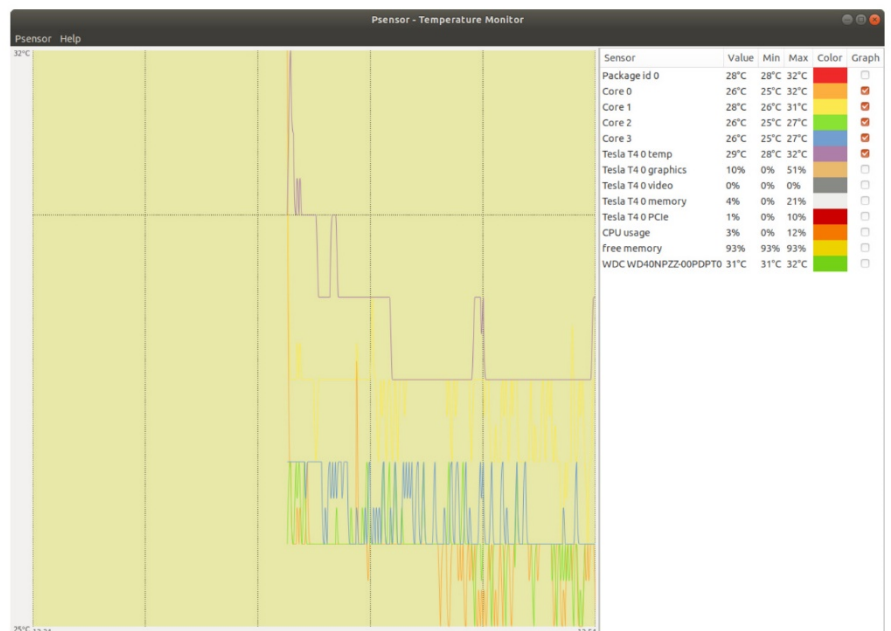

10.4 Edge AI Box NTP Server Build

Some users may want to turn their AI BOX into an NTP server to synchronize systems. The following is a process for turning the AI BOX into an NTP server.

This method can also be used to synchronize IP cameras.

* ntp installation

```

* Editing settings

# vi /etc/ntp.conf
```

* Add a # to comment out Line 21 starting with "pool",

* then add the server below

```

* When synchronizing IP cameras, there are a few restricted settings in the form of the following additions

```
restrict 192.168.0.0 mask 255.255.255.0 nomodify notrap
```

* If the camera side NW IP is 192.168.0.xxx. Camera settings are required to synchronize with AI BOX. Refer to the camera manual.

* save complete wq!

# systemctl restart ntp
```

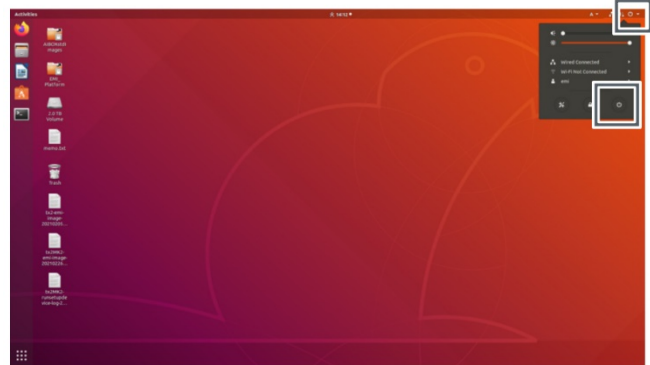

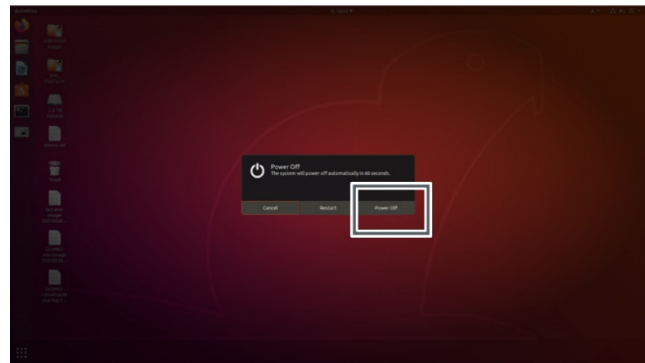
